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H

Hammer

A universal highly calibrated poundometer used for performing precise percussive maintenance. ¹⁾

HDI

Harley Davidson International - Sportsters sold outside the United States are sold by HDI.

Heat Cycling

A process of heating up and cooling down the engine's internal parts in stages to help insure mating/sealing of the piston rings to the pistons and cylinder walls. This process is used on a newly built engine and is done as a deterrent against microwelding.

Helical Gears

Gear teeth with a slight curve machined to reduce noise better than straight cut teeth ²⁾

Helicoil

A thread repair insert used to repair stripped threads i.e. spark plug hole threads

High Thrust Grippers

Term used in a 1967 magazine ad referring to the bead locking screws in the rear wheel on 67-69. ³⁾

Honing

A process using sanding stones or other abrasives to rough up cylinder walls after boring to help the rings seal. Also used with finer abrasives to achieve a final clearance dimension

Hoon

Hooligan ⁴⁾

Goodbye ⁵⁾

HT

High Tension. Describes the electrical circuit from the secondary side of the ignition coil to the spark plug ⁶⁾

HTFFSPTM

This is a technical term that means: hammer to fit, file smooth, paint to match - (milmat1)

HTHS (High Temperature High Shear) Viscosity

A measure of a fluid's resistance to flow under conditions resembling highly-loaded journal bearings in fired internal combustion engines, typically 1 million per second @ 150 °C. ⁷⁾

Hydraulic

A system of using liquid to transmit pressure from one place or another as in brake systems and clutches ⁸⁾

Hydrofinishing

Hydrogen treatment of crude oil in order to saturate the molecules and increase stability. ⁹⁾

Hydrometer

A tool to measure the gravity in a lead/acid battery
